Mr. GEORGE introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Claims

A BILL

For the relief of the Collier Manufacturing Company, of Barnesville, Georgia.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized and
4 directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not other-
5 wise appropriated, to the Collier Manufacturing Company,
6 of Barnesville, Georgia, the sum of \$48,719.70 in full settle-
7 ment of all claims against the Government for losses sus-
8 tained by said Collier Manufacturing Company on account
9 of the manufacture of undershirts for the United States Army
10 in the year 1918: *Provided*, That no part of the amount
11 appropriated in this Act in excess of 10 per centum thereof

1 shall be paid or delivered to or received by any agent or
 2 agents, attorney or attorneys, on account of services ren-
 3 dered in connection with said claim. It shall be unlawful
 4 for any agent or agents, attorney or attorneys, to exact,
 5 collect, withhold, or receive any sum of the amount appro-
 6 priated in this Act in excess of 10 per centum thereof on
 7 account of services rendered in connection with said claim,
 8 any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person
 9 violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty
 10 of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined
 11 in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

 3 dered in connection with said claim. It shall be unlawful
 4 for any agent or agents, attorney or attorneys, to exact,
